Thanks to Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital's unique location within the Memorial Hermann-TMC campus, specialists of all kinds are essentially just down the hall, ready to join their colleagues to provide expert advice and hands-on experience. As a result, patients may receive speedier, more efficient care, and families remain together. This is a huge relief when longer-term medical care is required and something that would simply be impossible in a more traditional children's hospital.

Protecting the gift of life when the unexpected happens

In fact, to see the emergency teams in action when a child's life is in danger is to grasp the depth of medical expertise and personal compassion available to patients at Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital, any time of the day or night.

- The Level IV neonatal ICU provides the highest level of care to premature and critically ill newborns as early as 23 weeks and weighing as little as one pound
- The trauma center is one of only two Level I pediatric trauma centers in the area
- Life Flight[®] has a dedicated pediatric team and the most advanced life support systems

The Fetal Center at Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital

For most women, having a healthy, full-term baby is a natural process at the hospital. But for high-risk moms, early intervention is critical to both mother and child. This is when the team at The Fetal Center steps in.

Known as maternal-fetal miracle-workers for babies with life-threatening issues such as spina bifida, diaphragmatic hernia, twinto-twin transfusion syndrome and heart disease, these specialists are prepared to operate in utero or the moment the baby has been delivered.

Using technology to spread the wealth

The hospital is committed to extending its reach beyond the Houston city limits. Through a new telemedicine project, for example, pediatric surgeons consult with doctors at Memorial Hermann The Woodlands Hospital to determine whether a child needs to travel to the Texas Medical Center for surgery or care, or would be served just as well locally.


A proud legacy continues

Faith



Emily and Caitlin Copeland are spirited 20-year-olds who, like many twins, have a lot in common. They even graduated from their high school as co-valedictorians.

Now in college, their futures are bright. But they began life with the odds stacked against them.

The twins were born conjoined at the liver and chest, a condition that has a low survival rate. Then Dr. Kevin Lally, a twin himself, came into their lives.

Surgeon-in-chief at Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital, Dr. Lally separated the girls when they were just 10 months old. Two decades later, the only signs of that experience are the twins' matching scars, big smiles and unending appreciation for everyone at Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital for the gift of independence, and life itself.

When Colette and Ivan Hagler went in for a routine sonogram, they expected to learn the sex of their baby. And they did. She was a girl they named Faith.

But they received unexpected and unsettling news as well. Faith had spina bifida, a complex and permanently disabling birth defect involving the spinal cord.

While babies with spina bifida typically receive treatment to repair their spines after they're born, Faith became the first in Texas to undergo this surgery in utero.

Dr. KuoJen Tsao, co-director of The Fetal Center at Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital and UTHealth, and Dr. Stephen Fletcher, pediatric neurosurgeon of Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital and UTHealth, performed the groundbreaking surgery. Nine weeks later, Faith was born.



Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital was the first in Texas to perform surgery before birth to treat spina bifida.

Faith, who is turning 6 this July, is an active, happy child who is more than just surviving; she's thriving. And jumping. And dancing. And singing. Thanks to another miracle from Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital.

Dominic

A typical Saturday morning at the Larkin household quickly turned terrifying when 18-monthold Dominic Larkin was found unresponsive in the family's hot tub.

Dominic's 11-year-old sister called 911 as his mom, Melissa, quickly performed CPR. Melissa was able to resuscitate Dominic, but his lungs had been severely damaged.

Within days, his condition deteriorated into respiratory failure. Dr. Matthew Harting, pediatric surgeon at Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital and UTHealth, treated Dominic with extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO), a procedure in which a machine takes over vital heart and lung functions until the patient stabilizes.

After weeks of lying motionless as ECMO did its job, Dominic graduated to specialized therapy and was soon released from the hospital so he could get back to the business of being a busy 2-year-old.

Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital is one of only two Houston hospitals offering pediatric ECMO, the breakthrough that helped bring little Dominic back to precious life.



"We have the busiest pediatric and adult trauma center in the U.S. right here, and that

combination and volume brings us a real depth of expertise. Children get the benefit of that—better evaluation, more rapid care, rapid resuscitation, blood availability, imaging availability, all these things link to having a high-functioning trauma program."
