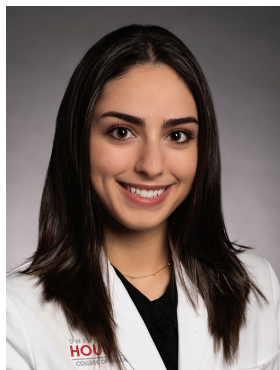


Lamees Loubani, PharmD Candidate
